
What does this mean for you and your children attending the school(s) identified below?

Great news! All enrolled students of *Arlington Grade School and Arlington High School* are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2018-19 school year. Your child will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee.

**The district will be requesting lunch applications from households with a student participating in the CEP; however, receipt of free breakfast and lunch meals does not depend on returning it. Completing the application is still necessary for other programs and may be used to determine if your household is eligible for these additional benefits.*
